The weather was kind to us so we were able to visit woodland, dune and marsh in the morning. After lunch we went to the Scrapes, where there were many birds on the water. Several times there was much discussion about birds' identities, as it is the time of year when many of them are in the process of changing their plumage in readiness for the mating season.

A largely white bird was finally identified as a Greylag. A long-legged bird with a long beak was unidentifiable and a bird flying overhead looked much like a Tern, but.... A very aggressive Moorhen seemed to be chasing away its young, as it was time for them to look after themselves. We had a good day and this is what we saw:

Flower Group and the Harmston Flower Festival

About 18 months ago the Flower Group began to bloom. There are 7/8 regular members and together we create seasonal arrangements accompanied by a great deal of laughter and chat. It is really a Discussion Group with a purpose. We always try to use foliage and flowers from our own gardens or the hedgerows, avoiding the expense of buying from shops and florists.

The ladies have produced some clever and beautiful creations, with the culmination this year being 'Harmston Flower Festival'. Plans for this have preoccupied us for months with various themes being suggested, until we settled on Dutch Contemporary Floral Art. Our inspiration came from a Dutch book (with an unpronounceable title) and contained wonderful arrangements that included flowers, fruit, vegetables, dried matter, rocks and candles. We chose our themes; we scoured Charity Shops and car boot sales for containers, mirrors, paintings of tulips and Delft pottery; we involved surprised members of U3A into painting a massive picture for auction of a Dutch girl and into lending their Dutch artifacts for display; we also ran the kitchen, selling cakes, Dutch soup and sausages, all with great efficiency.

The weekend of October 7th/8th was a triumph in Harmston Memorial Hall. On our chenille green and black cloths we displayed 25 quirky arrangements, ranging from the bizarre to the beautiful. Each was labelled with a one-word description in both English and Dutch. Despite it being October we had a large basket of white tulips, (silk and borrowed!) a mock up of an ice-cream, a dainty tea set, autumn flowers both silk and real, a conical tower of flower petals and Brussel Sprouts, candle displays including '4 candles' and one in 'lime green'. The fruit and vegetables 'contrivances' would have fed a large family for a week.

In Harmston Church, amongst the other beautiful sponsored arrangements, was the prettiest of all and created by our most expert Flower Lady. This sat on the piano, lighting up a dark corner with glowing autumn colours.

I would like to thank the Flower Group for accepting this venture so wholeheartedly and for supporting another of my 'wild ideas' to its conclusion. Church and Hall made a shared £1000, so it was all worth it.

September visit to Thorne's Beehives

Last year during the Magna Carta Celebrations, on the High Street near Lloyds Bank, stood a Baron decorated with Bees and Beehives, sponsored by Thorne's Beehives. This family concern was founded over a hundred years ago when the schoolmaster of Wragby commissioned the local carpenter to build a beehive. Through several generations the business prospered, outgrowing the factory site in Wragby and moving to an already built expansive workshop and office complex between Langworth and Wragby. The head of the family and his daughter (who know all of the one hundred employees by name) guided us through the fascinating processes of creating a variety of designs of beehives and beekeeping equipment, from the importation of wood to the packaging of goods for the British and international mail order markets.

In the large and well stocked shop that is open to the public, stands the Baron that the company bought at auction. Beyond the shop is the factory canteen where we enjoyed a substantial lunch at very favourable price. The canteen is open to passing trade and well worth a visit for coffee or a meal when in the area.
